Simple Sentence

Subject + Verb + Object

A simple sentence contains a subject and a verb. It expresses a single complete thought that can stand on its own.

The baby cried for food.



Simple Sentence

Subject + Verb + Object

Zaki Sir's intelligent students completed and turned in their homework.

- There are two verbs “**completed**” and “**turned in.**”
- The sentence expresses one complete thought.
- Therefore is a simple sentence.



Simple Sentence

Subject + Verb + Object

Zaifa and Zakin ate too much and felt sick.

Conjunctions (for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so)

two independent clauses

clause is a part of a sentence

it contains a subject and a verb

expresses a complete thought

compound contains two
simple sentences



The shoplifter had stolen clothes **so** he ran
once he saw the police.

Compound Sentence

Conjunctions (for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so)

They spoke to him in Spanish, **but** he responded in English.



“But” as a conjunction to separate two individual clauses.



Both sides of the conjunction “but” are complete sentences.
